- But reading the first letter of each line is a technique that comes up in puzzles more often than you might think!


What Is a Puzzle Hunt?

- A series of puzzles that you solve, typically in teams
- If you solve the final puzzle first you win!
- The puzzles might be in multiple rounds
- Each round will contain a **metapuzzle**, incorporating the answers to all the puzzles in that round
- It's possible the hunt also has a **metametapuzzle**, incorporating the answers to all the metapuzzles!

What Is a Hunt Puzzle?


- A puzzle that typically provides no explicit instructions on how to go about solving it
- BUT there need to be enough clues
- The answer will be a word or phrase in the English* language
- No other rules! Can consist of
 - Text
 - Images
 - Music
 - Video
 - etc...

What Isn't A Hunt Puzzle?



Sudoku. You know how to solve it and the answer isn't a single word.

What Isn't A Hunt Puzzle?



A random keysmash I decided translates to "WORD". But you have no way of knowing that.

Anatomy of a Hunt Puzzle

THE PUZZLING POEM

Title. You know what this is.

Anatomy of a Hunt Puzzle

Isadora Quagmire was looking for clues she could use to assist her friends the Baudelaires. She pored over a poem she had recovered from the estate of Josephine Anwhistle, a woman who had briefly served as the Baudelaire's legal guardian. The poem seemed cryptic, a word which here means "using its stilted meter and limited vocabulary to convey a hidden message."

Isadora knew that if she worked it out, she could unearth a glimpse into how Josephine felt about her time with the Baudelaires. But the poem was tedious and woeful, and riddled with with errors, even though Isadora knew that Josephine was famously proud of her grammar...

Flavor text. Not usually this long. Typically provides clues.

Body. The thing you need to solve.

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Not the answer! Puzzles often have multiple intermediate steps.

Solution

Corrected typos read RHYME SCHEME TO MORSE CODE "ay"lines are long = dash "ee"lines are short = dot /indicates new letter




Final answer :)

Metapuzzle Example

The Baudelaires have managed to escape Count Olaf, but they're still following the thread of a conspiracy marked by a trio of mysterious initials: V.F.D. What these letters stand for is anyone's guess, but it's clear that a host of friends and foes are involved, and that much of the secrets concern the Baudelaire fortune. If you can follow the clues from V to F to D and see what patterns emerge, you may learn more!

What Puzzle Hunts Are Out There?


- Puzzled Pint (newbie level!)

- Typically archives of hunts are still available/solvable after the hunt is over

- Reading through solutions if you're entirely stumped
- Knowing how to Google the CS way
 - All online tools are okay to use!

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


AWARDS SHOW

Indexing

- You know what this is already!
- MUTT 2, BASKETBALL 7, CHINA 1 → UBC
- Just remember indexing is 1-based and not 0-based in hunts :)
- And spaces don't count when indexing into multi-word phrases

If You See A Number...

- ...often it's one of two things
- an index into a word/phrase that you need to find
- the length of a word/phrase that you need to find
- sometimes, a puzzle will give you both numbers, sometimes just the index as the length isn't crucial for solving
- sometimes the numbers aren't obvious and you need to figure them out in other ways!

ISIS

- A now unfortunate puzzle acronym
- Identify
 - What is the content? Usually some media that you have to track down
- Sort
 - Is there a natural sort order for the content? If so, that's probably it
 - This step is not always required for all puzzles of this general type
- Index
 - Are there numbers or hints towards numbers that you can use to index?
- Solve
 - Put all the letters you've indexed together to get the answer

Count Everything
